

## Crochet Video Game Enderman

Pattern Written by Jayda InStitches 2015 – Happy Crafting!

### Materials

Yarn: worsted weight (size 4) 75 g in black, small amount of light purple & dark purple

Hook: 4.25mm / (G / 6) / UK 7

Scissors

Yarn Needle

Stuffing – Polyester Fiberfill

### Stitch Legend

r – row

st(s) – stitch(es)

ch(s) – chain(s)

sl st – slip stitch

sc – single crochet

### Notes (Read these before you start!)

- number of stitches you should have at the end of each row will appear in parentheses
- all body parts are made in flat pieces which are later sewn together. Make sure you've made the correct number of each part!
- Sew all pieces together on the OUTSIDE, this will firm up the seams and make it more square than round.
- Don't overstuff your body parts, they will lose their squarish appearance!
- It is important to choose yarn that is all the same size to ensure an even gauge among the pieces.

### Pattern

#### **Head Front, Back and Sides – Make 4**

Ch 9

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and in each across (8). Ch 1, turn

**R2 – R7:** sc in each st across (8). Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

At the end of Row 7, fasten off and weave in ends.

#### **Head Top & Bottom – Make 2**

Ch 9

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and in each across (8). Ch 1, turn

**R2 – R8:** sc in each st across (8). Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

At the end of Row 8, fasten off and weave in ends.

#### **Body Front & Back – Make 2**

Ch 9

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and in each across (8). Ch 1, turn

**R2 – R12:** sc in each st across (8). Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

At the end of Row 12, fasten off and weave in ends.

#### **Body Sides - Make 2**

Ch 13

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and in each across (12). Ch 1, turn

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**R2 – R4:** sc in each st across (12). Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.  
At the end of Row 4, fasten off and weave in ends.

### **Body Top & Bottom - Make 2**

Ch 9

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and in each across (8). Ch 1, turn

**R2 – R4:** sc in each st across (8). Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

At the end of Row 4, fasten off and weave in ends.

### **Arm Sides – Make 8**

Ch 28

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook and in each across (27). Ch 1, turn

**R2:** sc in each st across (27). Fasten off and weave in all ends.

### **Arm Top & Bottom – Make 4**

Ch 3

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and in the next ch (2). Ch 1, turn

**R2:** sc in each st across (2). Fasten off and weave in ends.

### **Leg Sides – Make 8**

Ch 26

**R1:** sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook and in each across (25). Ch 1, turn

**R2:** sc in each st across (25). Fasten off and weave in all ends.

### **Leg Bottom – Make 2**

Ch 3

**R1:** sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and in the next ch (2). Ch 1, turn

**R2:** sc in each st across (2). Fasten off and weave in ends.

## **Assembly**

### **Head**

Facial Features – Refer to Chart below

Pick a Head side to be a Face. With yarn needle and light purple yarn, whip stitch back and forth (no more than 3 stitches) across the 3<sup>rd</sup> row from the bottom of the Face, ducking under the middle Face stitch each time. This will create 2 long rectangular ‘Eyes’. Knot ends behind face. With yarn needle and dark purple, whip stitch 2 short stitches over top of the middle of the long Eye stitches. Knot all ends behind face. Refer to template below.

- Sew front, back and side pieces together.

- Sew top on

- Sew three of the four edges of the bottom piece down, stuff lightly and then finish sewing.

**Body** – sew as for Head

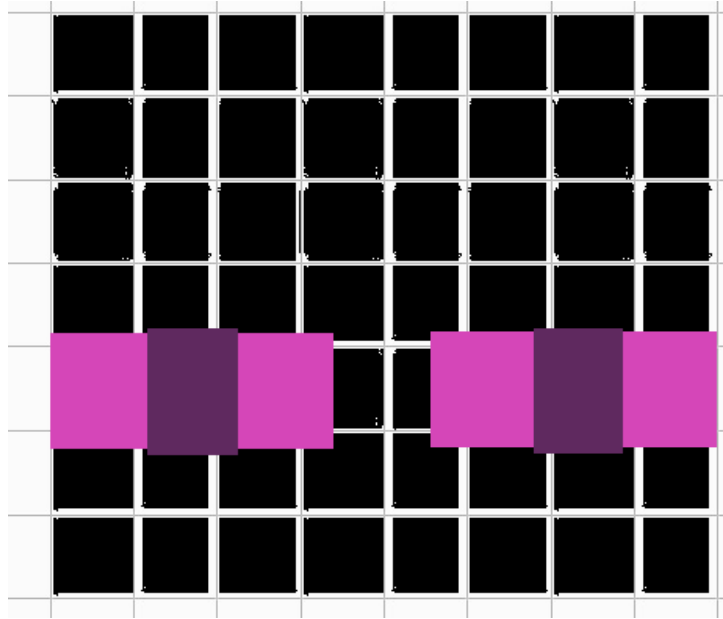
**Arms** – sew sides and bottom as for previous body parts. When stuffing, use small amounts of stuffing at a time, and gently push it to the end using the blunt end of a crochet hook, chop stick or eraser-tipped pencil. Sew on top.

**Legs** – Sew and stuff as for Arms. Legs can be stuffed a little more firmly than the other pieces to allow Enderman to stand upright, but be careful not to over stuff!

Sew Body to Head, across the bottom middle of the Head piece (Body is thinner than the Head is wide).

Sew the Legs to the bottom of the Body at either end. There should be space between the Legs.

Sew Arms to each side of the Body by anchoring them across three stitches on the underside of the Arm and the corresponding stitches on the side of the Body. This will let the Arms move a bit. \*\*\*If making this toy for a smaller child, it is advisable to sew the arms down firmly by sewing all the way around the top 4 rows of the Arms\*\*\*
