

V-Stitch Dishcloth Crochet Pattern (HDC Variation)

Free Pattern Written by Jayda InStitches 2016 – Happy Crafting!

Materials

Yarn: Cotton worsted weight (size 4, 4 ply) an 80g ball will make at least 2 dishcloths

Hook: 4.25mm / (G / 6) / UK 7

Scissors, Yarn Needle

Stitch Legend

r – row

st(s) – stitch(es)

ch(s) – chain(s)

sl st – slip stitch

sc – single crochet

hdc – half double crochet stitch



Notes

- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each row will appear in parentheses
- A V-Stitch is created by working (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in the same st
- Ch-2 at the beginning of each row counts as a half double crochet
- When working sc down a raw edge in the border row, try and keep your stitches as evenly spaced as they appear when being worked into regular rows – this requires some eye-balling!
- This pattern can be worked over a foundation chain row that is any multiple of 3

Pattern

Ch 30

R1: (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in the 4th ch from the hook (V-Stitch made!), *skip 2 sts, V-Stitch in the next st*.

Repeat from * to * across to last 2 stitches, skip 1 st, work hdc in the last st. Ch 2, turn (29)

R2: V-stitch in each ch-1 space of the V-Stitch of the previous row, hdc in the top ch of the turning chs from the previous row. Ch 2, turn. (29)

Repeat Row 2 for a total of 15 Rows. Do not fasten off. Ch 1, do not turn.

Border

work (approximately) 20 sc down the raw edge of your dish cloth, 2 sc in first ch of the foundation ch row, sc across the bottom chs ending with 2 sc in the last ch, work the same number of sc up the other raw edge (as you did the first raw side), 2 sc in the first st of Row 15, sc across the top of Row 15, before you join your row, ch 12 and sl st into the same st, join with a sl st to the first sc. Fasten off and weave in your ends.
