



Crochet Snowflake

Pattern Written by Jayda InStitches 2015 – Happy Crafting!

Materials

Yarn: small amount of thin white yarn

Hook: 4.25mm / G / 6 OR 5.50mm / I / 9 (see notes)

Scissors

Yarn Needle

Steam Iron (optional)

Stitch Legend

r – row

st(s) – stitch(es)

ch(s) – chain(s)

sl st – slip stitch

sc – single crochet

dc – double crochet



Notes

- if you want a lacy looking snow flake, use a bigger hook and thin yarn
- if you want a slightly thicker flake, best for appliqué for children's clothing, use the larger hook and yarn no bigger than a size 3

Pattern

R1: make a cinch circle, 12 sc into the circle, cinch tightly closed, sl st to first sc to close circle, ch 1 (12)

R2: sc in the same st as joining. *dc into the next st, ch 3, sl st into the 2nd and 3rd chs from the hook, (ch 2, sl st into the 2nd ch from the hook and into the base ch of the other ch 3) twice, dc into the same st as dc, sc into the next st along the circle*. Repeat from * to * for 6 Snowflake arms. When finished the final arm, sl st into the top of the first sc. Fasten off and weave in the end.

Gently pull each tri-picot point of each arm into a nice shape. If desired, you can steam block your Snowflake by steaming it with an iron. **Don't press the iron to the Snowflake!**
